

WHY YOU NEED A PROJECT MANAGEMENT CERTIFICATION IN TODAY'S MARKET?



You should consider acquiring a certification for personal reasons as well. It's no secret that continuing education comes with many benefits, **such as the ones listed below**.




Recognition

Certifications show that you have the expertise to lead projects and the specialized knowledge necessary to manage diverse teams on various projects.





WHICH PROJECT MANAGEMENT CERTIFICATIONS ARE AVAILABLE?

Like many other fields, there are many certifications available for those wishing to work in project management. Project management certifications are generally broken down by methodology (traditional, Agile and hybrid) and then by position. Below, you'll find a few of the most common project management certification categories.

Traditional and Agile Project Management Certifications

Many of the best project management certifications cover **traditional** and **Agile** project management methodologies. Many consider **the Project Management Professional (PMP) certification** by the Project Management Institute (PMI) to be the best.

PMI's Certified Associate in Project Manager (CAPM) certification is also highly regarded and is ideal for aspiring project managers. Those who wish to specialize in a traditional methodology will appreciate the PRINCE2 Foundation and Practitioner certifications, while those who want to manage Lean teams and projects should look no further than Six Sigma.

Agile Certifications

- If you're a **project manager**, an Agile coach or an individual involved with an Agile team who wants to further their career and become an expert in the field, you owe it to yourself to take a closer look at Agile certifications like the PMI-Agile Certified Practitioner (PMI-ACP) or the ICAgile Certified Professional (ICP).
- Agile certifications will help you show prospective employers that you have a firm grasp of Agile principles and values. They'll also show that you can successfully manage an Agile team, are comfortable working in a fast-paced environment where rapid change occurs and can communicate with stakeholders, team members and clients

Scrum Certifications

- Scrum certifications are one of the best ways to show current and prospective employers that you understand the Scrum framework well.
- Scrum certifications, including the Certified Scrum Master (CSM), Certified Scrum Product Owner (CSPO) and Professional Scrum Master (PSM), will show that you can motivate and lead scrum teams, create product visions, refine backlogs, appease clients and stakeholders, are highly flexible and more



HOW TO CHOOSE THE RIGHT PROJECT MANAGEMENT CERTIFICATION

There are a **few factors** to consider when it comes to choosing **the right project management certification**.

- **?** What do you want to achieve in your career?
- Do you prefer traditional project management methodologies and their strict, predictive planning schemes, or do you like the flexibility of the Agile way of life?




These are all important questions to ask!

Of course, there are many other factors to consider. Examine your education history and skill level, and assess your project management experience. You must also **consider your personal finances** and the **amount of time** you can dedicate to continuing education before acquiring a certification.

In addition, reflect on where you want your career to go. Do you want to jump in the deep end and become a project manager immediately, or do you wish to hold a different position within a project management team? Take a hard look at how you see your career progressing and make a decision about a certification based on that vision.




POPULAR PROJECT MANAGEMENT CERTIFICATIONS

Below, we'll examine **the most popular** project management training offerings, revealing what they cover, how much they cost and what you can expect if you pursue a certification.

While searching for project management certifications, we looked for the most widely recognized options that are accepted both nationally and internationally, offer great value for the money, and enhance a participant's career and earning prospects.



1. Project Management Professional (PMP)



Many consider the Project Management Institute's Project Management Professional certification the best for project managers. It covers managing conflict, collaborating with project stakeholders, managing and assessing risk, planning and project compliance, and more.

Obtaining the PMP will prove to current or potential employers that **you can manage traditional and Agile projects** and that you have the ability and knowledge to lead project teams to success. No matter which industry you work in, you'll easily be able to apply what you learn.

Obtaining the PMP certification comes at a price. The cost varies for PMI members and non-PMI members. Members pay **\$405** to sit for the exam, while non-members pay **\$575**.





Considered by many to be the defacto standard of training for those who want to become scrum masters, the Scrum Alliance's 14-hour **Certified Scrum Master (CSM) course** could be for you. You'll gain a thorough understanding of the Scrum framework and techniques, scrum events and artifacts, and how to lead a scrum team.

Before you can sit for the exam, you must attend a 14-hour course. Prices vary by provider, but you can expect to pay **between \$300 and \$1,500**. This course will serve you well if you plan on working in IT, manufacturing, marketing and more.



3. Professional Scrum Master (PSM)



Scrum co-founder Ken Schwaber designed **the Professional Scrum Master course**, which is run by Scrum.org. This is another highly regarded course and certification. Individuals holding this certification should be able to find work leading scrum teams in various industries, such as IT, public services, advertising, marketing, production and more.

The course teaches Scrum theory and application, Scrum principles and values, communication skills, the importance of self-managing teams and the complexities of product delivery. The course cost varies by provider, but you'll typically pay **between \$995 and \$1,495**. The cost of the exam is included in the course fee.

The SAFe® Scrum Master course equips attendees to coach Agile teams to deliver business value at scale. The course teaches you the tactical skills needed to be an effective Scrum Master in a SAFe organization. It also gives you the guidance and tools necessary for working in remote environments with distributed teams.

If you want to become a certified scrum master with the skills to help leading companies succeed with Agile and scrum, the SAFe® Scrum Master course is for you. Learn how scrum masters empower and lead Agile teams. Understand how to facilitate Agile events like iteration planning, team sync, and iteration retrospectives. And discover how to help teams plan and complete their work using SAFe Scrum and SAFe Kanban. You'll also learn the principles of servant leadership, so you can help develop high-performing, engaged, continuously improving teams in your own organization.


After taking the course, you'll know how to:

- Empower and lead an Agile team
- Facilitate Agile events like iteration planning, team sync, and iteration retrospectives
- Help teams plan and complete their work
- You'll also learn the principles of servant leadership, which are crucial for key SAFe team roles. These skills will
 enable you to develop high-performing, engaged, and continuously improving teams in your own organization.

The **SAFe Scrum Master certification** is ideal for existing scrum masters who want to manage multiple Agile teams at an enterprise level.

The two-day, 14-hour course, which costs **between \$1,000** and **\$1,500**, will prepare you to facilitate scaled Agile events, plan work with SAFe Scrum and SAFe Kanban techniques, support project increment execution, coach Agile teams, implement continuous flow and teach servant leadership principles that will help you develop continuously improving teams.






The **Certified Scrum Product Owner course** is a 14-hour introductory offering for those who wish to become product owners or learn what this scrum team member does. It's suitable **for current POs** who want a refresher, scrum masters, data analysts, business analysts, project managers and other team members.

The required course – available online or in person – features 14 hours of certified instructor-led training. **You'll pay \$300 to \$900**. During the course, you'll learn about the basics of Scrum and team roles, customer satisfaction, managing releases and product backlogs, creating sprints, and communicating the product vision and overall goal with the scrum team.





The Project Management Institute (PMI) offers the PMI Agile Certified Practitioner course to anyone who wants to prove their Agile abilities. This certification covers methods such as Scrum, Lean, Kanban and test-driven development (TDD), and shows that you can manage teams, thrive in highly demanding situations and collaborate efficiently.

Becoming certified isn't easy, but it can be lucrative. According to the Master of Project Academy, individuals with this certification **can earn up to \$120,000 annually**. If you want to showcase your Agile skills and prove that your Agile knowledge runs deep, the PMI-ACP could be for you.

It's worth noting that this is a secondary certification suited for those with expansive Agile knowledge and experience. The price to sit for the exam differs for PMI members and non-members. **Members will pay \$435, while non-members will pay \$495.**


Develop and accredit a course for Agile Fundamentals

If you're just **starting out** in project management and want to specialize in Agile, the **ICAgile Certified Professional in Agile Fundamentals (ICP) certification** could be for you. Sixteen hours of training will introduce you to Agile values, principles and foundational concepts.

Topics covered include the origins of Agile, how to establish an Agile mindset, incremental development and product adaptation. By the end of the course, you **will know what it means** to "be agile while doing Agile." The course does not focus on any particular Agile methodology. Instead, it teaches you how to achieve organizational agility with any Agile method.

Course prices for this certification range **between \$599 and \$1,100**, depending on the provider. It's a small price to pay considering this certification could help you launch a career in project management.





If you're just getting started in project management, the **Certified Associate in Project Management (CAPM)**, offered by the Project Management Institute (PMI), is for you. This entry-level certification is the precursor to the more advanced PMP course and is ideal for junior project managers.

Obtaining the CAPM will show employers that **you can lead** Agile teams, have solid collaboration skills and can communicate with peers and stakeholders. It also verifies that you understand Scrum, Lean, Kanban and test-driven development and can deliver value to customers.

Participants who sit for the exam will be tested on Agile frameworks and methodologies, business analysis frameworks and predictive plan-based methodologies. The exam varies in price for PMI members and non-members. **PMI members will pay \$225, while non-members will pay \$300**.





Projects in Controlled Environments 2 (PRINCE2 for short) is a project management methodology that government agencies (and private companies) use when they need to justify every aspect of a project. This highly structured method, which asks the who, what, when, where, why and how of every task, is complex and not for the faint of heart.


PRINCE2 certifications are divided into two categories: **Foundation** and **Practitioner**. The Foundation certification shows that you've learned the theoretical knowledge of planning, managing and delivering projects using PRINCE2.

The Foundation exam covers people management, enhanced project flexibility, digital data management and project performance, and is designed for project managers and aspiring project managers.

You can either take a course to help you prepare or self-study for the exam. The Practitioner certification tests your readiness to apply PRINCE2 knowledge in real-world scenarios and is designed for project managers with experience in the field.

The PRINCE2 7th Edition Foundation exam costs \$680, while the PRINCE2 7th Edition Practitioner Exam costs \$755.





Project managers can learn invaluable analytical skills through **Six Sigma courses**. Six Sigma certifications show potential employers that you have thorough knowledge of project planning, resource management and cost analysis.

If you obtain a Six Sigma certification, **you'll be highly sought** after for your ability to lead teams, control quality, solve problems, mitigate risks, eliminate waste and increase profits. The idea behind Six Sigma is to earn various certifications, including Yellow, Green, Black and Master belts. Each belt represents the depth of your knowledge of Six Sigma principles

Prices vary for each certification. The Yellow Belt certification exam costs \$99, the Green Belt exam costs \$159, the Black Belt exam costs \$229 and the Master Black Belt exam costs \$665. You must hold the preceding belt before sitting for each subsequent exam.



PROJECT MANAGEMENT CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Now that we have looked at some of the most popular project management certifications, it's time to take a closer look at what's required to obtain them. As you can imagine, the requirements for each certification vary wildly. Ensure you meet the requirements before choosing one.

Project Management Professional (PMP)

The PMP certification has many prerequisites. The Project Management Institute offers a **challenging 230-minute exam** that tests applicants with 180 questions (175 scored and five unscored) in three categories: people, process and business environment. The prerequisites are listed below.

Required Educational Experience

- **Education**: A four-year college (bachelor's degree) or university degree, or a high school diploma or secondary education certificate
 - **Project management education**: You need 35 hours of project management education or to hold the Certified Associate in Project Management (CAPM) certification

Required Professional Experience

- With a college or university degree: You must have 36 months of experience leading projects during the last eight years if you have a four-year degree or university degree.
- With a high school or secondary education certificate: You must have 60 months of experience in project management from the previous eight years if you have a high school diploma or secondary education certificate.

You'll also **need to renew** your PMP certification every three years, which requires you to obtain 60 professional development units (PDUs) and pay a member fee of \$60 or a non-member fee of \$150.



Certified ScrumMaster (CSM)

- The Certified Scrum Master certification is fairly lenient when it comes to prerequisites. After completing the mandatory 14-hour course, participants sit for a 60-minute exam. You must correctly answer 37 of 50 questions to pass. There are no other prerequisites, such as work experience or prior educational requirements.
- You must renew the certification **every two years for \$100 and earn 20 SEU** (scrum educational unit) points.

Professional Scrum Master (PSM)

- There are no educational or work prerequisites for the Professional Scrum Master certification.
 Anyone who wants to complete the roughly 16-hour course and sit for the 60-minute exam can do so.
- To pass the exam, you need to **score 85% or higher**. If you fail on the first attempt, don't worry you can sit for the exam one more time at no extra cost. As a bonus, you won't need to renew this certification.

SAFe Scrum Master Certification

To become **SAFe Scrum Master certified**, you must score **73% or higher** on the 90-minute, 45-question, multiple-choice, closed-book exam. There are no formal requirements, but an understanding of Scrum and how it works is recommended. You must renew the certification annually for \$100.



Certified Scrum Product Owner (CSPO)

Though a grasp of Scrum will help, you do not need any work-related or educational experience to qualify for this Scrum certification course. Still, the course is best suited for scrum masters, product owners, project managers, development team members and those with Scrum experience. There is no examination, but you must renew the certification every two years.

PMI-Agile Certified Practitioner (PMI-ACP)

- The PMI-ACP has several requirements, including 21 contact hours of training in Agile practices, 12 months of general project experience in the previous five years or PMP/PgMP certification, and eight months of Agile project experience in the previous three years.
- The exam features 120 multiple-choice questions and lasts three hours. Once certified, you **must** earn 30 professional development units (PDUs) each year to keep the certification current.

ICAgile Agile Fundamentals (ICP)

- You can take this course in person or remotely. As a general rule, no final exam is required to pass, but not every provider is the same. Some teachers may require an exam, while others could use alternative means to determine that you have learned enough. Reach out to your chosen provider to see how they grade the course.
- The only hard-and-fast requirement is that you attend a 16-hour training class. There are no other educational or work-related requirements.



Certified Associate in Project Management (CAPM)


- To obtain the **CAPM certification**, you must pass a 150-question, multiple-choice test covering the fundamentals of project management and project management roles. You must meet some prerequisites before you can sit for the exam.
- You'll **need a high school diploma** or the global equivalent and **23 contact hours of project management education**. The PMI recommends that individuals take the Project Management Basics course (\$350) to satisfy the contact hour requirement and learn about the exam topics.

PRINCE2 Foundation/PRINCE2 Practitioner

The PRINCE2 7th Edition Foundation exam consists of 60 multiple-choice questions, lasts 60 minutes and is closed book. You must score 60% or higher to pass the test, and you'll have to renew the certification every three years. There are no prerequisites for the exam.

To sit for the Practitioner exam, you must show proof of having passed one of the following certifications:

The Practitioner exam features 70 questions. To pass, you **must answer 42 correctly (60%)**. The exam lasts two and a half hours and is open book. The certification must be renewed every three years.

Six Sigma

- Each **Six Sigma certification** has its own requirements and numerous tests. The Yellow Belt certification has no prerequisites and involves 11 tests. The Green Belt certification requires three years of full-time work experience in approved fields and features 24 tests.
- The Six Sigma Black Belt requires three years of full-time employment in approved fields or two completed Six Sigma projects. It involves 33 exams, each with 10 to 15 questions. The Master Black Belt exam features 150 questions and lasts four hours. Six Sigma certifications do not expire.

How can you be sure you're sinking your time and money into a course that will truly benefit you? We'll answer all of these questions and more in the following sections.


CHOOSING THE MOST SUITABLE PROJECT MANAGEMENT CERTIFICATION FOR YOU

As you have seen, there are many project management certifications to choose from. It is important to choose one that matches your career goals, the industry in which you wish to work, and your current educational and work-related experience.

THE LAST THING YOU WANT

is to try to obtain a certification that is beyond your current skill level, which could lead you down the wrong career path or financially ruin you.

→ How can you be sure you're making the right choice? All it takes is a little selfreflection.



Sit down and think about your career goals. What does your current project management experience look like? Do you want to be a project manager, a product owner or a scrum master? Do you want to work with Agile teams, scrum teams or organizations that prefer more traditional project management methods? How much money do you want to make?

Do your due diligence and take the time to research each certification. Determine what the requirements are, what you'll learn, how long it will take to obtain the certification and how much it will cost. In addition, dig around on project management academy websites; you'll find some self-assessments that can help you better understand your current abilities.

Once you complete these steps and answer the above questions, you can narrow down the certification options and choose one that matches your goals.



CHAPTER 3: CHOOSING THE RIGHT CERTIFICATION FOR YOUR CAREER

At the end of the day, it's crucial to look at the current project management market, technologies and preferred working styles.



Still, **PLENTY OF INDUSTRIES** use highly structured, traditional project management methodologies such as Waterfall and the Critical Path Method to complete projects.

Modern organizations are increasingly adopting highly adaptable and flexible Agile work methods, especially in manufacturing, human resources, marketing, and creative and software development. If these areas interest you, strongly consider a certification that will show that you can lead Agile or scrum teams.


In summary, **do** your research, **think** about the industry you want to work in and then **decide** on the kind of certification you wish to obtain.


ALTERNATIVE WAYS TO BECOME A PROJECT MANAGER





A quick Google search for project management courses will bombard you with links to institutions with impressive-sounding names and fancy websites, all of which can make an institution seem legitimate and trustworthy.




Still, though most academies are probably legitimate, we **encourage** sticking with specific academies that are industry leaders.

Before parting with your money, take the time to research the learning institution you're considering. Check the institution's websites, read the "about us" pages and look for business information such as annual income and details about the founders.

You can also explore business pages on LinkedIn and peruse community forums such as Reddit and Quora for real-life reviews and experiences. **DON'T BE AFRAID TO ASK QUESTIONS**.

It's crucial to ensure that the institution and the course you take are accredited and that the certification is globally recognized. This is especially important in the era of remote work. Failure to do so could lead to heartbreak, and wasted time and money. Don't take an institution's word or website at face value – do your research and make the right choice the first time.
